



# CLEVER WAYS TO CORRAL YOUR CLUTTER

Our very best time- (and sanity-) saving home-organization ideas for kitchens, laundry rooms, home offices and more, including tips from four of Canada's expert organizers!

The entranceway is one of the most used and most neglected areas in a home. To make things easier at the end of a busy day, provide each member of the family with a space for their gear. Use bins to store such small items as hats, mittens and scarves. Have a file by the door to hold any mail, instead of just dumping it when you come in. Putting a simple system in place will make it much easier to stay organized.

#### 1 Stand tall

Add function and make a stylish statement with a patterned umbrella stand that houses other upright items, such as yoga mats and shoehorns, too.

#### 2 Take a seat

A place to perch by the front door provides a convenient spot to slip shoes and boots on and off. Choose a stylish chair instead of a bulky bench to keep the space from looking too crowded.

#### 3 Coat check

Set the tone for your home right from the front door. To ensure that coats and accessories are immediately hung up instead of thrown on the floor, mount hooks at various levels to make them accessible to everyone, no matter how small. Source hooks with multiple pegs to accommodate more items, but don't go overboard.

#### 4 Under foot

Designate a spot for shoes to dry—in this case, an oversize vintage silver serving tray. Don't worry about it being too fancy for footwear; a tray like this will only get more beautiful with age, but to prolong its shelf life and to catch water and dirt, place an absorbent mat (try a ribbed rubber or synthetic fibre, such as olefin or polypropylene) on top.

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The biggest advantage in a kitchen is accessibility, yet the most common blind spots I see are cabinet shelves that are too high and wasted space between shelves. Whether you've just moved in or you've settled into a kitchen, it's worth the time to adjust shelving to fit the contents and to lower shelves so you can reach what you need. After adjusting the height, you can often add an extra shelf to accommodate wide narrow items, like trays. — Marie Potter, Professional Organizers in Canada, Vancouver



Display your pretty serving pieces on open shelves and use decorative baskets to house the less attractive and infrequently used kitchen necessities (think small appliances and tools).

1 Looking good

2 Mix it up Varied storage keeps items of different sizes in their place: deep drawers for mediumto-large appliances, stacked shelving for wine bottles and shallow drawers for spices.

3 Within reach Keep the items you need most, such as cereal and snacks, between waist and eye level, and move the rest of the goods up high or down low.

4 All access

5 Now you see it Cabinets that are tucked behind a sliding door will provide a functional space-saving solution to a typical pantry. This storage system can be built along an unused wall in a kitchen. Use it to conceal mismatched boxes, jars and canned goods.

## 1 Command centre

Nail clipboards to the wall and use them to manage work projects or to keep paperwork for everyone in your family organized.

2 File maker Eliminate desk clutter and give important documents a place to land by using easy-toaccess vertical

clear—and all of your inspiration in full view—by hanging an oversize corkboard above your desk.

## 4 Dreamy drawers

Tuck a filing cabinet under a wraparound desk to keep your office supplies and paperwork neat and tidy. Insert a plastic divider or place several small boxes inside the top drawers, and add a hanging-file system to the bottom one.





Create a system that involves a recycling bin for things you no longer need, a file for items that need to be mailed, filled out or paid, and a sturdy plastic banker's box to store papers you'll need in the future, like tax and legal documents.

#### 1 Double duty

To make this space work harder, use it as a utility room to store household essentials such as toilet paper and paper towels. Remove items from packaging, then place them in baskets. The uniform look is tidier, and it makes

everything more accessible.

#### 2 Hang on

Walls are often underutilized when it comes to storage, but they're a great place to stash cleaning supplies when floor space is at a premium. Thread twine or a leather lace through the

hole on a broom's or mop's handle, then tie the loop securely. Hang the loops on hooks that work with the room's style; here, rustic metal adds charm and patina. (Make sure all items are thoroughly cleaned before putting them back in their place!)

#### 3 Out to dry

A spot for hanging clothes to dry is a must. Make the most of every inch and gain counter space without sacrificing floor or wall real estate by tucking a permanent or pressure-mounted rod under the counter and stocking it with sturdy hangers.

#### 1 Sliding drawers

Multiple openface pull-out drawers help compartmentalize items based on season and style, making it easier to keep folded items in check without them spilling over.

### 2 Custom order Install an adjustable

closet system that allows for modifications (hanging height, shelving and drawer space) and includes a shoe system.

#### 3 Group therapy

To give your closet an orderly appearance, use one style of hangers. Also, group clothing by category, like colour or style.

#### 4 Reach for the top

Rotate wardrobe staples seasonally and designate topshelf storage for rarely used or offseason pieces. Use up-to-the-ceiling shelves to maximize space and discourage boxes from pooling on the ground.
