






HEN OTHMAR PRENNER BOUGHT an old farmhouse on a mountain in the northern Italian region of Val Venosta (Vinschgau), the sculptor and designer had only the most vague plans for the property, which consisted of a living room, storeroom and hayloft. "I thought of doing something with it one day," he says, though he had no idea what — or when. But the opportunity was too good to pass up: the house, which was built in the 14th century, had belonged to his uncle, and he'd known it as a child, having grown up on a neighbouring mountain.

For two years, the chalet sat untouched, without electricity or even running water. Initially, Othmar intended to turn it into a holiday home or studio that he could visit a few times a year, but the more time he spent in his old stomping grounds, the more

attached he became. "At some stage, it dawned on me: this isn't going to be a holiday home; this is where I'm going to live!" he says.

That's when his impulsive purchase became a family project: his father, uncle and brother, a trained carpenter, immediately set to work turning the run-down structure into a contemporary escape. The quartet built a modern, gabled addition onto the original shell. An abundance of warm wood tones keeps the spare architecture from feeling cold and heightens the impact of the spectacular snowy views. Othmar designed much of the furniture himself, tinkering with each design until a precise form was matched with optimal functionality.

Now, what was once a tiny, neglected dwelling has become an endlessly inspiring creative retreat for Othmar, who says he never feels isolated in his cosy home despite its secluded locale. "I can't imagine only living in the big city anymore," he says.




